Nativity of John the Baptist Tuesday, June 24th

During this week, we will celebrate the solemnity of the nativity of John the Baptist. In many European countries, bonfires are held to honor St. John. This is the Church's response to the pagan fire festivals that celebrated the summer solstice on midsummer night - the same time as this solemnity. The Christianization of such an event is significant. In the scriptures, St. John the Baptist cries, "Prepare the way of the Lord" (Matthew 3:3). He calls us to ready ourselves to receive the great light that is Christ. The solemnity of St. John's nativity occurs during a time when sunlight begins to decrease - days get shorter, and night falls earlier. John himself said:

You yourselves can testify that I said [that] I am not the Messiah, but that I was sent before him. The one who has the bride is the bridegroom; the best man, who stands and listens to him, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom's voice. So this joy of mine has been made complete. He must increase; I must decrease. (John 3:28-30).

As St. John calls us to 'prepare the way' (Matthew 3:3), we wait for the light that will increase (literally) with his birth at Christmas.

Lectionary

- GOSPEL: Jesus encourages the disciples to not fear and to have faith in God during times of uncertainty and anxiety. We are, indeed, worth more in God's eyes than a whole flock of sparrows, none of which fall to the ground without God's knowledge.
- FIRST READING: Jeremiah denounces those who seek to trap him in his preaching - those who seek to destroy him for what he has been prophesying. The faith of the prophet, however, prevails and it is voiced strongly in the second half of the reading.
- PSALM 69: The psalmist sings of the faithful servant who bears insult and injury. The Lord hears the cries of the poor and does not ignore their trials.
- SECOND READING: We continue the semicontinuous reading from St. Paul's letter to the Romans. Today he tells the Romans that just like sin (and thus death) entered the world through one man, so does the abundant grace of God come into the world through the one man, Jesus Christ.

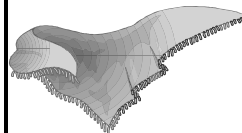

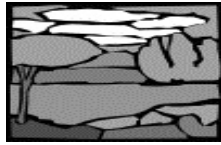

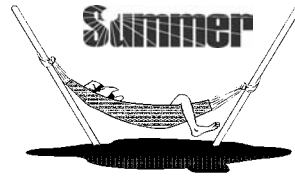
**HOLY NAME SOCIETY
