**13th Sunday
in
Ordinary Time**

Last Sunday we saw Jesus commanding the wind and the waves with a word. This week, we see Jesus in control of an even more elemental force - death itself. Our prayers and readings recall God's loving care for every human creature, even - especially - those who seem rejected by others.

THE FIRST READING is from Wisdom, one of the "newest" books in the Old Testament - scholars believe it was written only about fifty years before Christ. Here is a God who gives life, and only life: "God did not make death," the writer boldly asserts (Wisdom 1:13). Everything God created was intended to be "wholesome" (1:14). The second part of the reading recalls Genesis. Since God created human beings in the divine image, human beings ought to share in God's immortality; but through the devil, death came into the world. The world is, or was, fundamentally good.

RESPONSORIAL PSLAM 30 gives voice to the two women who are healed in the Gospel today: "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me" (refrain).

THE SECOND READING In 2 Corinthians, Paul is addressing the subject of the collection for the needs of the Church in Jerusalem. Christ became poor for our sakes - and we have the privilege of becoming like him. The goal is equality. We share our abundance with those in need, and others will share with us in our turn. Paul quotes Exodus 16:18, the story of the manna in the wilderness. Our giving should be modeled on God's giving, neither too much nor too little, but enough to satisfy the needs of all. In making reference to this passage, Paul also implies that Christian giving is a way to express out trust in God to provide for us tomorrow as he has provided for us today.

THE GOSPEL: In the Gospel we catch a glimpse of the whirlwind of activity in which Jesus lives his ministry. He has just calmed the storm at sea, and how he crosses the sea again, only to encounter a synagogue official named Jarius, whose daughter is gravely ill. Where was Jesus headed when the synagogue official asked him for help? The evangelist doesn't tell us; all we know is that Jesus willingly sets aside his plans to go to this child who needed him. On the way, a sick woman comes forward and touches Jesus' cloak. (Scripture scholars call this intercalation, the "sandwiching" of two stories together to make a point.) Jesus senses that "power had gone out from him" (Mark 5:30): it would seem that in giving life to others, he empties himself. Jesus takes time to find the woman, to speak with her, and to bid her go in peace. Then Jesus finally reaches the little girl. Although it seems too late, he takes the child by the hand and raises her to life. He then tells the people to give the girl something to eat. In so doing he demonstrates that she is truly alive (he would himself ask for something to eat after his Resurrection) and at the same time shows a tender awareness of all her needs.

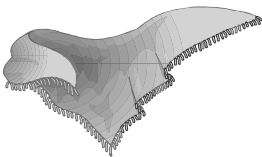
