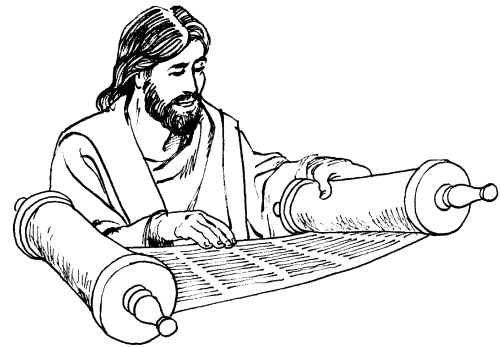

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



Today we return to proclaiming Luke as the primary evangelist of the season. We are still in the midst of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

FIRST READING: The book of Nehemiah describes Ezra's reading and interpretation of the law in the midst of the assembly. Although the people are moved to tears. Nehemiah challenges the assembly to turn from mourning to rejoicing, for God's law is a gift that signals God's blessing. As we rejoice in the gift of God's word, we are strengthened by the Lord to live it.

RESPONSORIAL: In response to the reading from Nehemiah, the Church proclaims in song the blessings of God's law. God's law brings wisdom, joy, and enlightenment to those who follow it.

SECOND READING: Paul unfolds for the Church at Corinth the organic unity and the vital contribution of each member of the Church, the body of Christ. The source of unity and of the unique gifts of each member is the Holy Spirit given in Baptism. As members of the one body, we share in one another's suffering, honor, and ministry on behalf of others. We are invited to surrender those attitudes of envy and jealousy that keep us from living out the gift of unity bestowed on us in the Holy Spirit.

GOSPEL: The power of the proclamation and interpretation of God's word by Ezra is echoed and surpassed in Jesus' proclamation and interpretation of God's word by Isaiah.

Jesus affirms that Isaiah's prophecy of God's Holy Spirit resting upon his chosen one has been fulfilled. Jesus is God's anointed. As Nehemiah invited delight in the proclamation of God's word, today's Gospel calls us to delight in Jesus our Messiah and Lord, for God's word is both proclaimed and fulfilled in him.

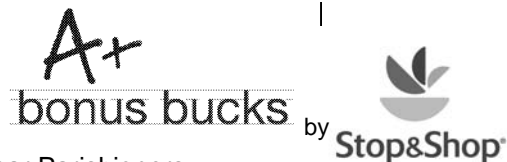

FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION

THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY CONTINUES TO PROVIDE FREE FEDERAL AND NJ STATE INCOME TAX PREPARATION FOR SENIORS AND DISABLED MEMBERS OF ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE PARISH. TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SERVICE, YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED MEMBER OF ST. THOMAS, AT LEAST 62 YEARS OF AGE OR DISABLED, NOT ACTIVELY EMPLOYED AND REQUIRE NO MORE FORMS AND SCHEDULES THAN THOSE LISTED BELOW.

INCOME TAX RETURNS WILL BE PREPARED BY EXPERIENCED TAX PREPARERS WHO ARE ACTIVE MEMBERS OF THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY, VOLUNTEERING THEIR TIME AND TALENT IN THE SPIRIT OF STEWARDSHIP.

INCOME TAX RETURNS WILL BE LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING FORMS AND SCHEDULES:

- FEDERAL FORMS 1040, 1040A, 1040EZ
- FEDERAL SCHEDULES A, B, D, E (RESIDENTIAL RENTAL ONLY), AND R.
- NJ STATE FORMS 1040NJ AND 1040NJHR
- NJ SCHEDULES B, C, AND HR-A

THE TAX PREPARATION PROCESS FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL OR MARRIED COUPLE WILL INCLUDE AN INTERVIEW, REVIEW OF YOUR 2008 TAX RETURN AND TURNOVER OF YOUR TAX DOCUMENTS (1099's). COMPLETED RETURNS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN ABOUT ONE WEEK.

TAX PREPARERS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE PARISH CENTER EVERY FRIDAY FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 12:00 NOON BEGINNING FRIDAY, JANUARY 29, 2010.

IT WILL NOT BE NECESSARY TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT. COME IN TO THE PARISH CENTER TO GET YOUR TAXES DONE OR TO SPEAK TO A TAX PREPARER.
