We have a group of mostly 7th and 8th grade students, so we will try to life of Christ/life of the Church.

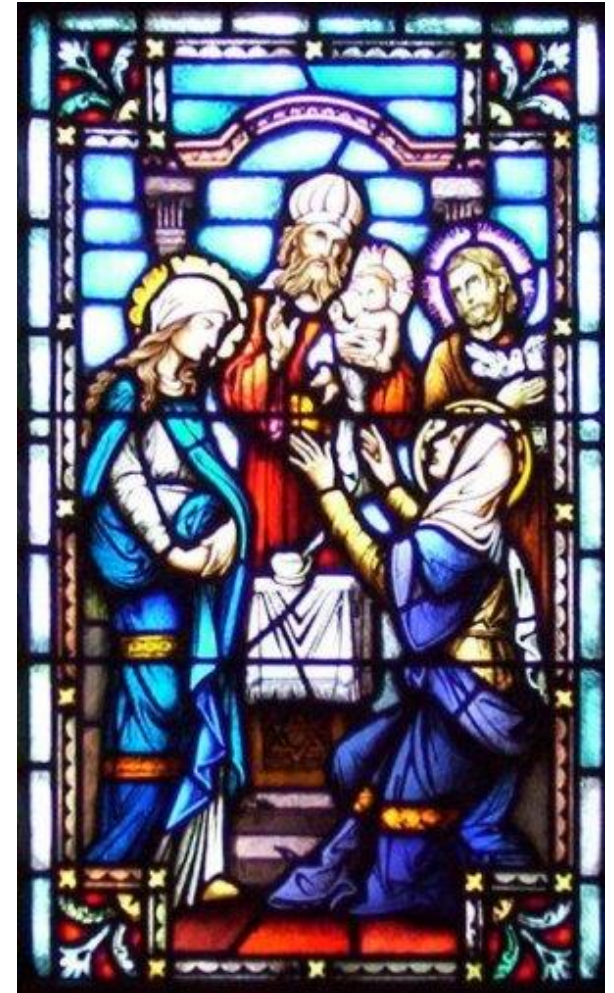
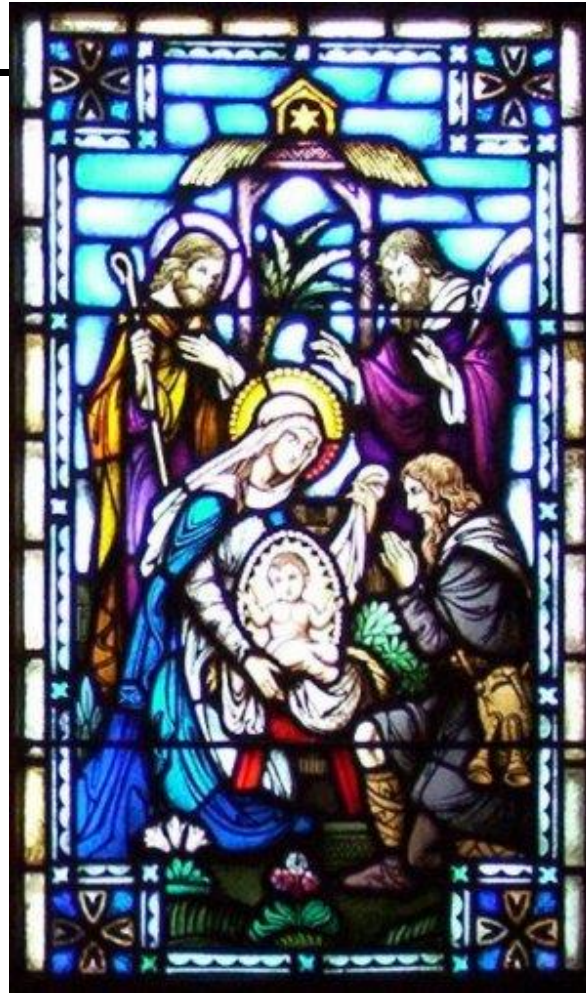
Life of Christ

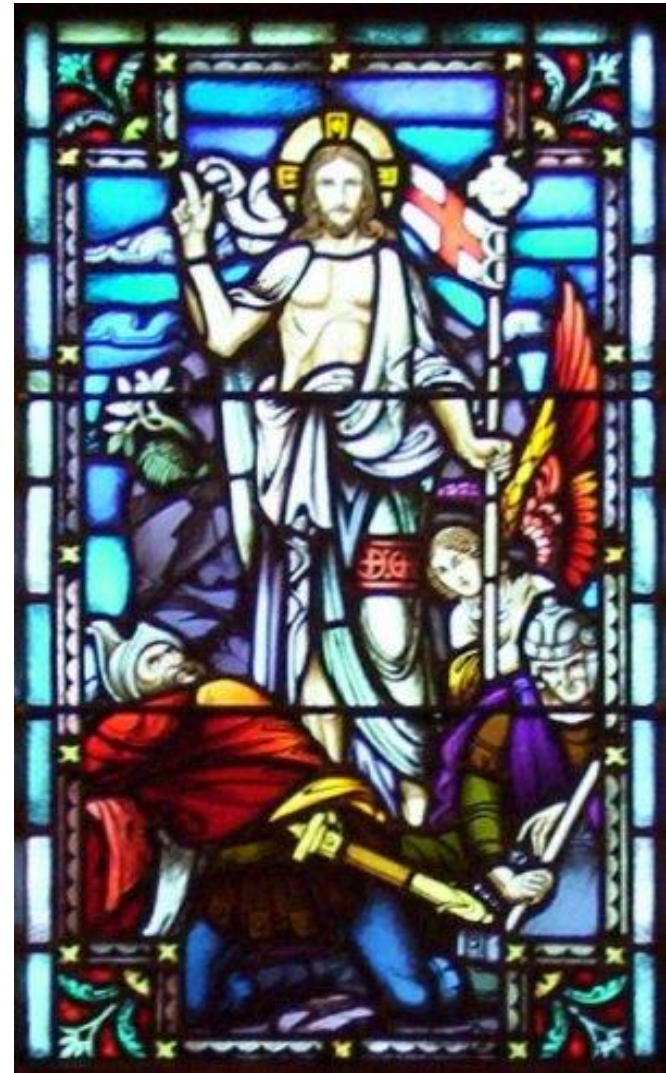
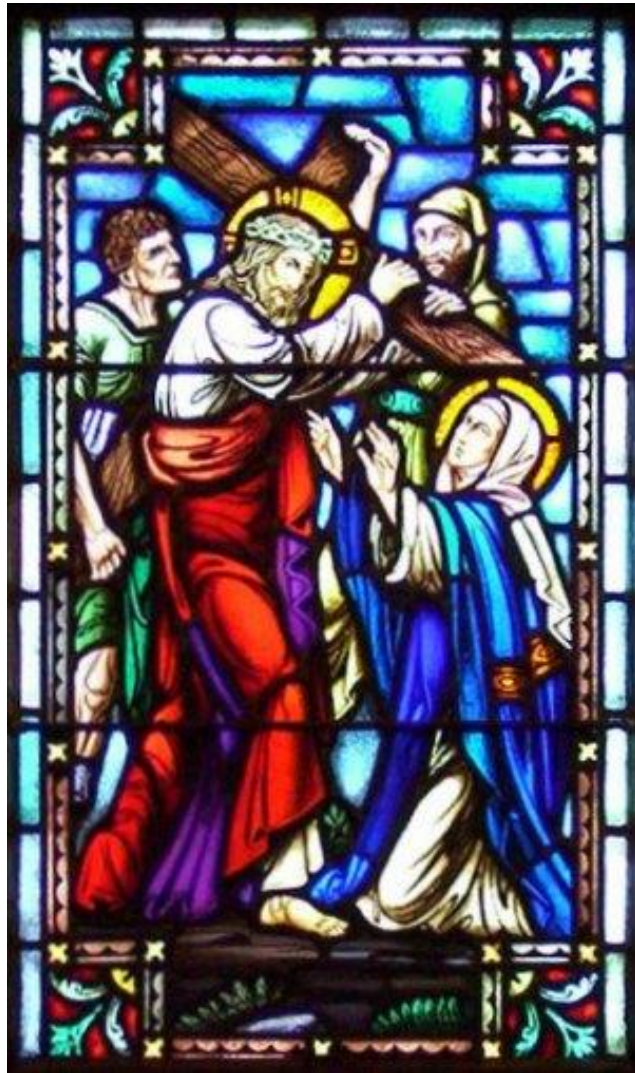
Life of Christ

During Jesus' life, He

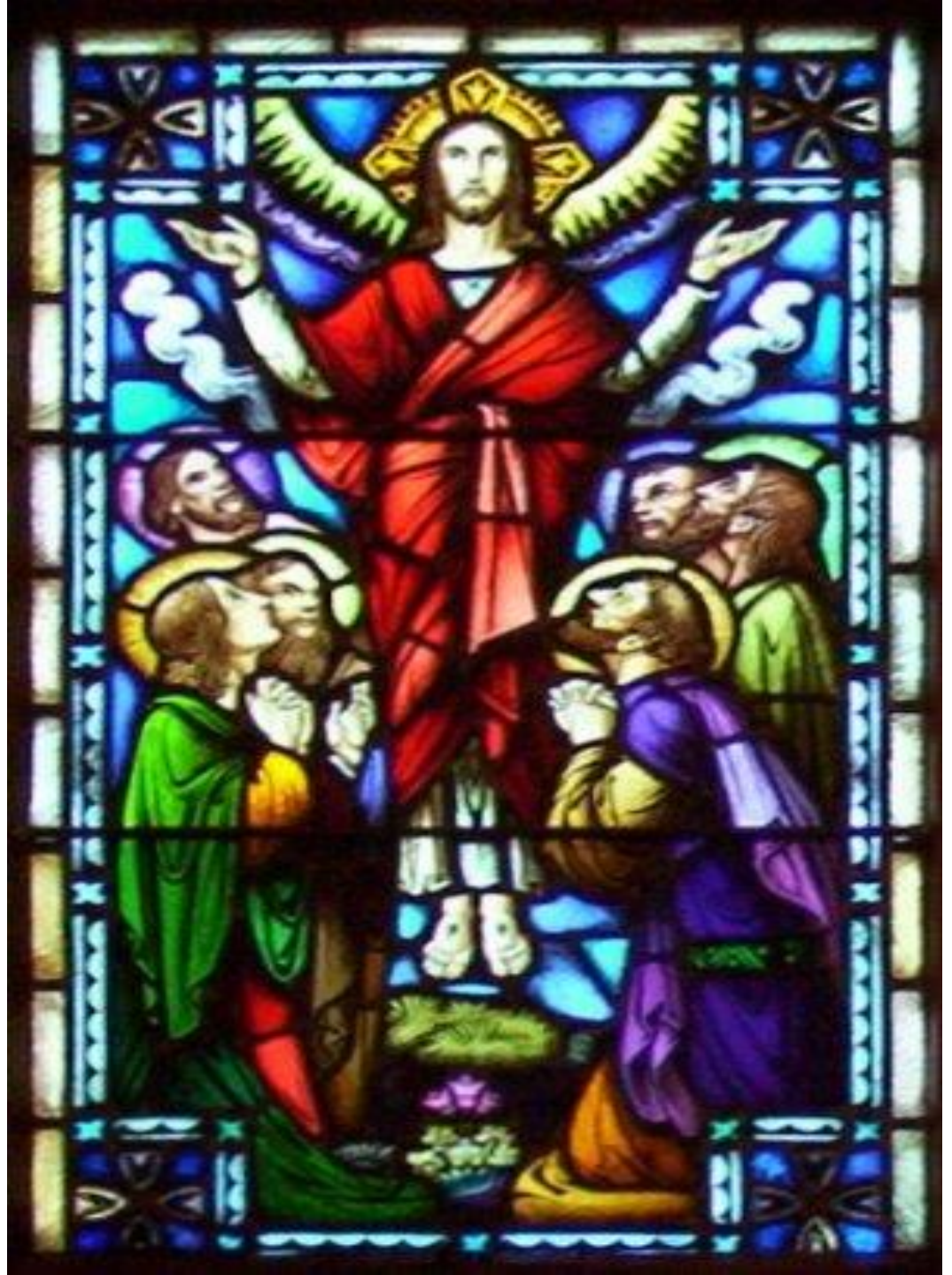
- Recruited the Apostles and sought out disciples

Early Church in the New Testament

- Acts of the Apostle
- Paul's missions through the Mediterranean areas writing to the Churches
- Other writers like John and Peter.
- Christians witnessing to Jesus by the way they live their lives

- Christianity becoming accepted by the Roman Empire (Edict of Milan in 313 AD)
- Development of Doctrines/Teachings by Councils (Bishops gathering to define them as a group)
