# Sacrament Symbols

- Matrimony – Ring and cross
- Holy Orders – Priestly stole (cloth worn around the neck)

# Jubilee Year of Mercy

The Jubilee of Mercy that Pope Francis has called, from December 8, 2015 – November 20, 2016, is an Extraordinary Jubilee. This designation as an "Extraordinary Jubilee" sets it apart from the ordinary cycle of jubilees, or holy years, which are called every 25 years in the Catholic Church. By calling for a holy year outside of the normal cycle, a particular event or theme is emphasized. For example, Pope Francis called this particular Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy to direct our attention and actions "on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's actions in our lives . . . a time when the witness of believers might grow stronger and more effective"

# Rosary



A devotion that consists of the Apostle Creed, Our Father and Hail Mary and a couple other prayers.

Tradition has it that St. Dominic was given the devotion by Mary and the infant Jesus in a vision.

October is a month that is especially dedicated to praying the Rosary.

The Angel Gabriel coming to Mary and Jesus being put in the her womb.





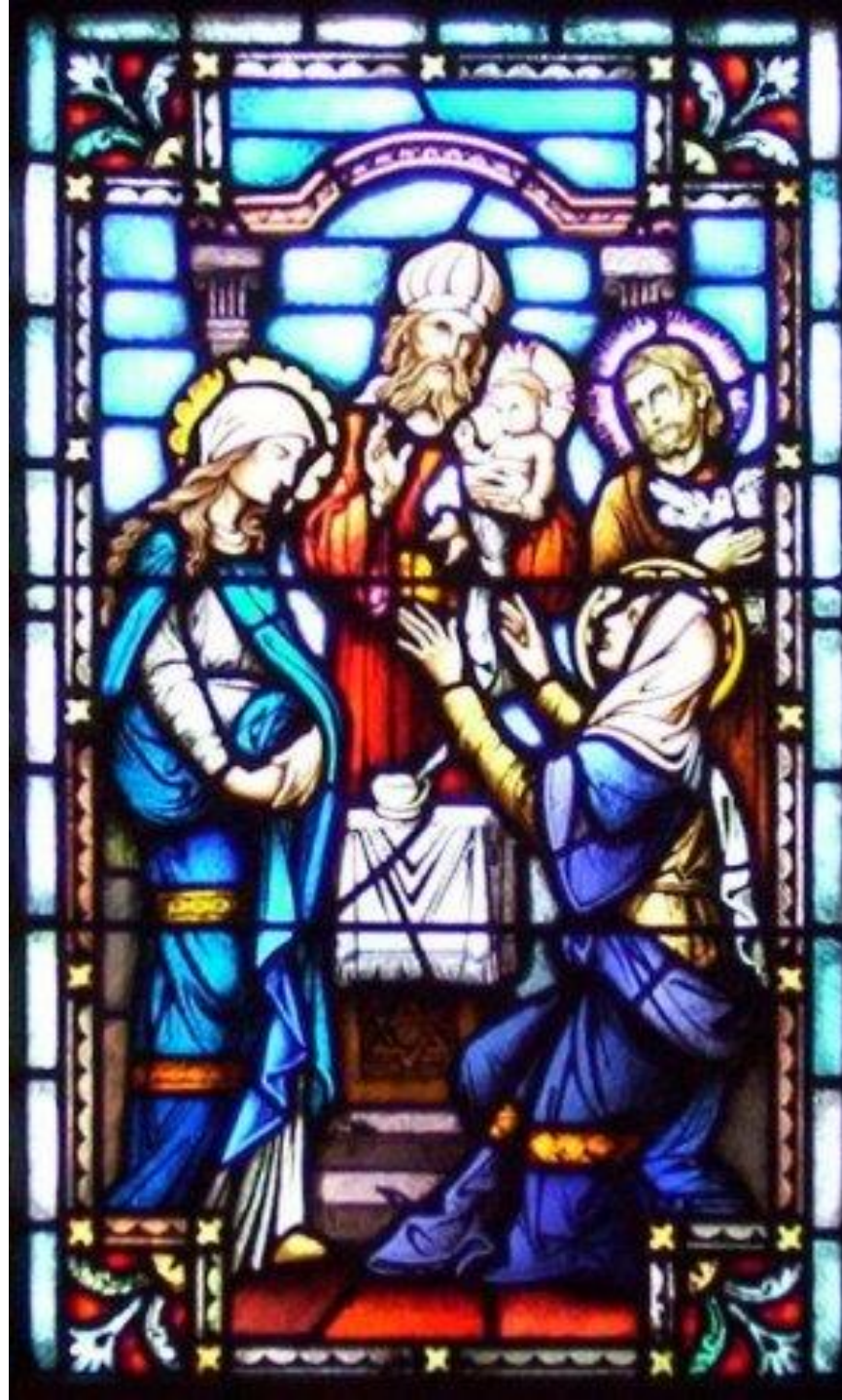
# Visitation

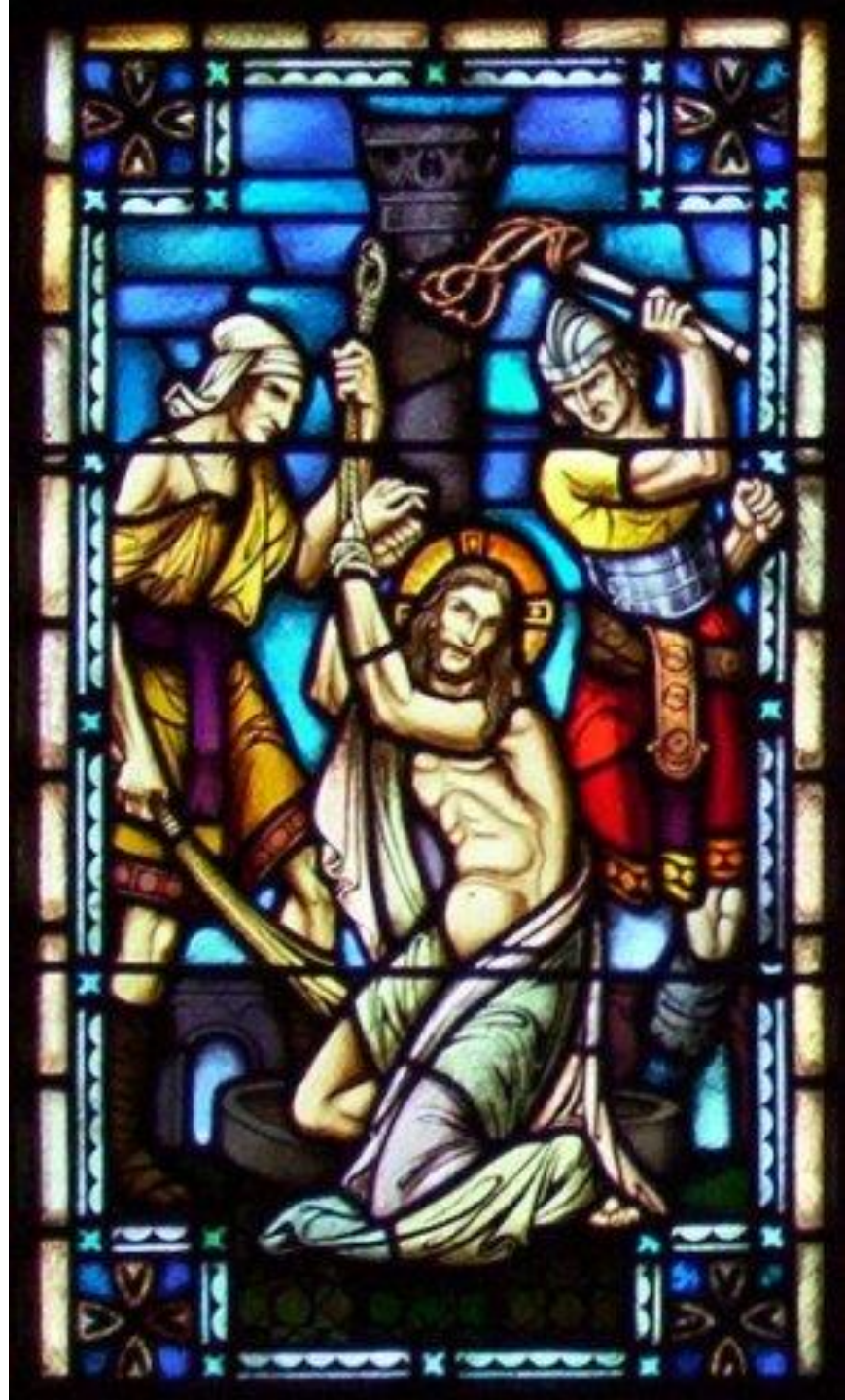
# Some Major Events in Jesus' Public Ministry

# Carrying the Cross

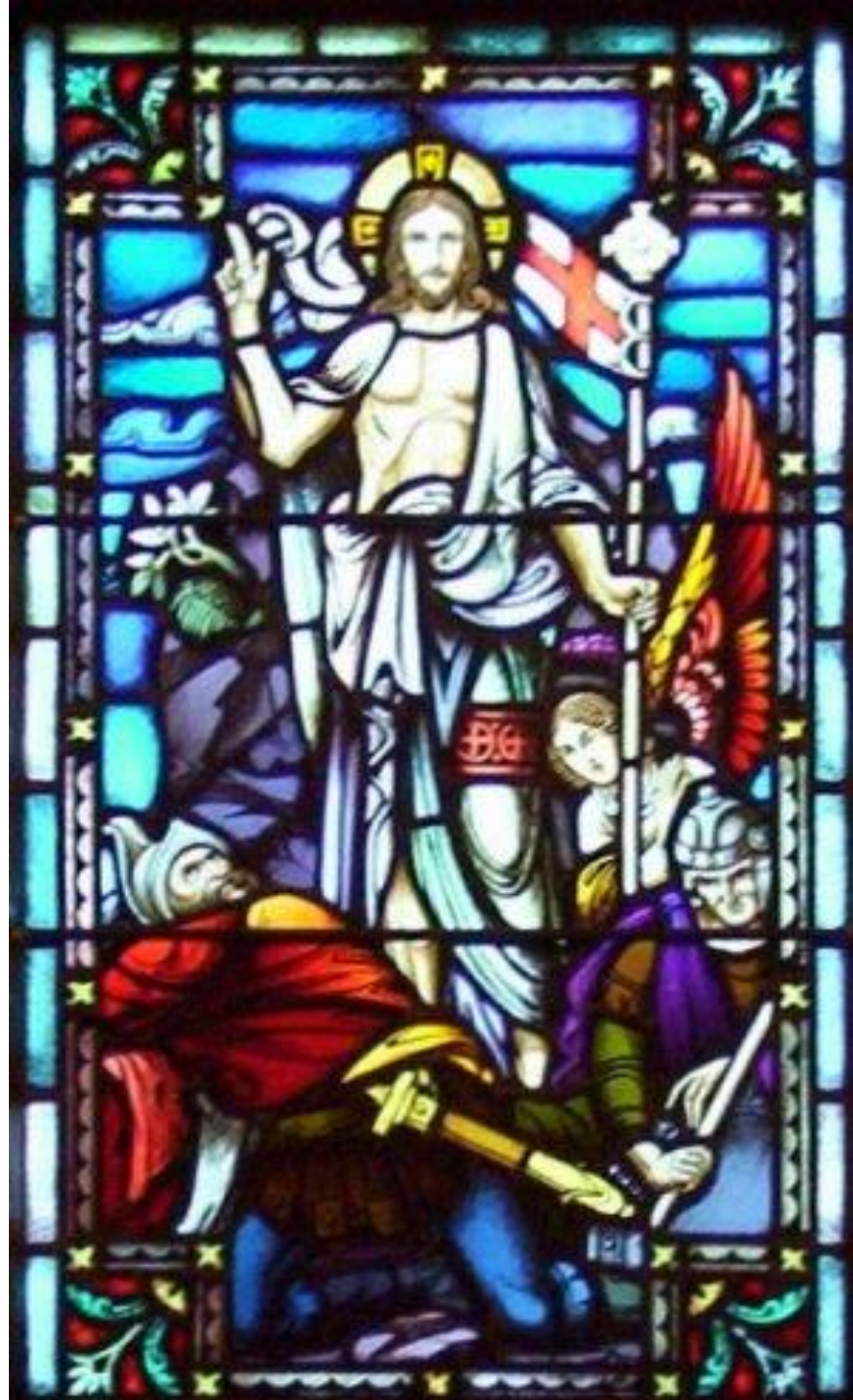
Carries the Cross to

service to help him



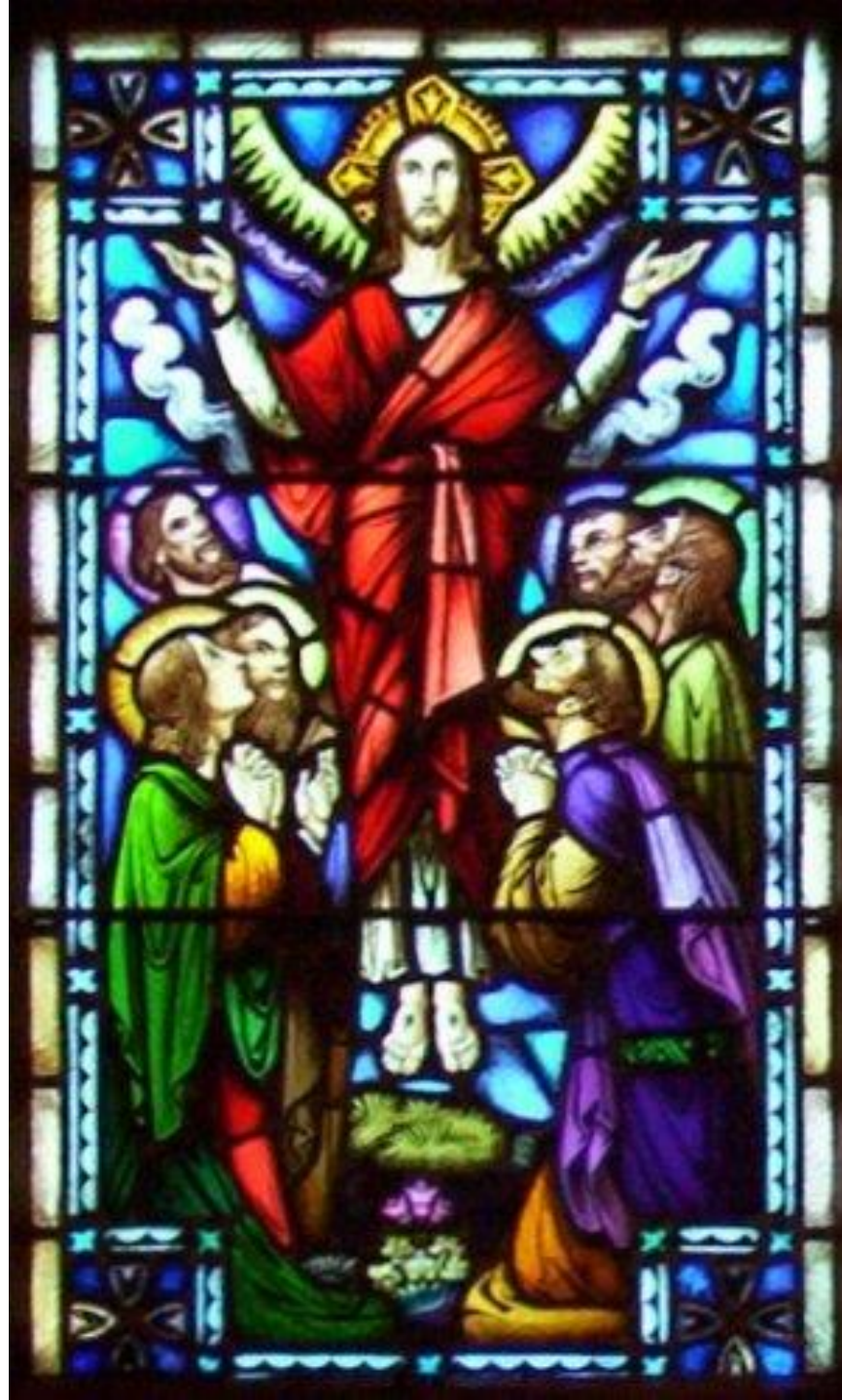
# Crucifixion

Jesus rises three days after his crucifixion and we celebrate this for 50 days during the Easter Season and every Sunday.

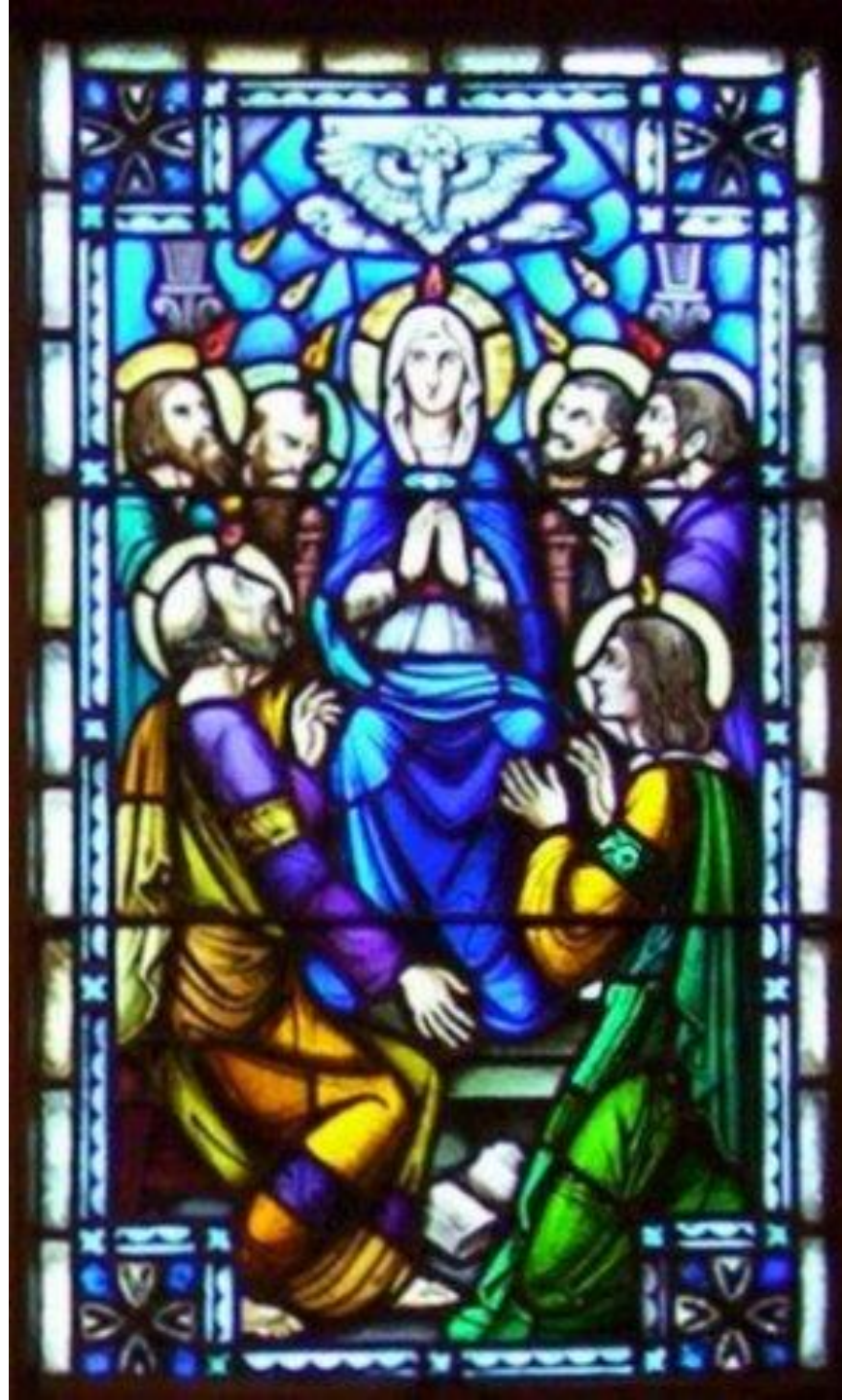


# Ascension
