Epiphany of the Lord

The Epiphany of the Lord is one of the great solemnities of the liturgical year. Traditionally celebrated on January 6th, the twelfth day after Christmas, it is so important that in many countries, including the United States of America, it is transferred to the nearest Sunday. Why is it so important? Because it is our celebration. At Christmas, we celebrate the Word becoming flesh. At the Epiphany, we celebrate the news getting out—revelation of this amazing reality to the world.


Epiphany comes to us from the East, as its Greek name indicates. The word means "manifestation, showing forth or advent." In the Eastern Churches, this day marked three great moments in the life of Christ: his manifestation to the Gentiles (the wise men of Matthew 2), his baptism in the Jordan (Matthew 3, Mark 1, Luke 3, John 1), and his first miracle at Cana (John 2). While the Church in the West emphasizes the visit of the Magi to the infant Christ today, with the Baptism of the Lord commemorated on its own nearby feast, a hint of the ancient origins of the Epiphany survives in the antiphons at the Liturgy of the Hours for today: "Three mysteries mark this holy day: today the star leads the Magi to the infant Christ; today water is changed into wine for the wedding feast; today Christ wills to be baptized by John in the river Jordan to bring us salvation" (The Liturgy of the Hours, antiphon for Evening Prayer II, volume 1, p. 573).

FIRST READING: The poetry of Isaiah begins with Jerusalem—"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come" (Isaiah 60:1). But this light that shines over Jerusalem becomes a beacon light for the whole world. As the reading continues, the prophet sees people of every land drawn by that great light, and bringing to Jerusalem all their riches.

RESPONSORIAL: Psalm 72 is a prayer for a king whose rule lasts forever, and whose reign is justice and peace. This king, with his special care for the poor and the afflicted, will be obeyed not just by one nation, but "all nations shall serve him" (Psalm 72: 11). Notice the allusions to kings from far-off lands, bringing gifts.

SECOND READING: St. Paul has glimpsed the mystery of God's grace, freely given not only to Israel but to the Gentiles. And God gives his grace abundantly, for the Gentiles will not be second-class citizens, but "co-partners," equals (Ephesians 3: 6).



PARISH INFORMATION

REGISTRATION DIG 400 Know for

ST. THOMAS PARISH

If you are presently not on our mailing list, receiving envelopes and the various parish mailings, the chances are that you are not a registered member of our parish. You are not automatically a registered member because you were married here or even if you were brought up here and lived in the parish with your parents-or went to school here. Membership is by formal registration only. Just call the Parish Center at (973) 338-9190 and let us know that you wish to register and the registration form will be mailed to you. Thank you.

How Do I Arrange a Wedding?

Archdiocesan policy requires that arrangements be made with a Parish Priest at least one year before the wedding date. Arrangements can be made by calling the Parish Center, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. You should be a registered parishioner of St. Thomas in order to be married here.

"Time of Marriage"

Well in advance of making other arrangements for your wedding, the time of your marriage should be arranged with one of the Parish Priests.

'Directives'

You should consult one of the parish priests concerning the current Church law when a Catholic is marrying a person of another faith. All procedures for Marriage Preparation must still be followed,

In preparation for Marriage here at Saint Thomas, you would ask you to be willing to follow the norms set by Canon (Church) Law, Archdiocesan and Parish Policy.

Baptisms

We remind you to contact the parish at least three months prior to the Baptism of your child.

We have scheduled various dates for Baptisms during the year. These schedules are published in the Bulletin and are available at the Parish Center.

Baptism is a community celebration. Individual Baptisms are normally performed only in case of necessity.
