*Second Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Our readings continue the themes we have heard throughout the Christmas season. Jesus is the servant prophesied by Isaiah, the one for whom John prepared the way. By our Baptism, we too have been called to be servants of the Gospel.

**FIRST READING:** The First Reading is drawn from the second of the four “servant songs” in Second Isaiah (we heard a portion of the first of these servant songs last Sunday). Talk about vacations! From his mother’s womb, this man has been called to be the Lord’s servant. At the end of the reading we get a glimpse of what the servant’s mission will be – not simply to “raise up” and “restore” God’s chosen people, Israel, but to be “a light to the nations” (Isaiah 49:6), so that God’s salvation can reach to the whole world.

**RESPONSORIAL:** Psalm 40 is the song of a faithful servant of the Lord, who speaks the justice of God without fear. In the antiphon – “Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will” – we hear the willing, joyful response of Jesus; but as we join in the response, we make those words our own.

**SECOND READING:** The Second Reading is the very beginning of 1 Corinthians, which we will read for the next two months. Today we hear the formal greeting with which the letter opens. Paul follows the custom of the ancient world in stating clearly at the outset who the letter is from, who it is for, and adding a greeting of good will. But unlike most letters of the time, Paul does not focus on the titles and dignity of those whom he addresses; instead, he casts everything in terms of relationship to God. The only title he claims for himself is “apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God” (1 Corinthians 1:1); and he addresses the Corinthians as the “church of God,” “sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy” (1 Corinthians 1:2). Before entering into his subject Paul humbly remembers where his authority is from – and he reverently acknowledges the presence of God in the community to whom he writes.

**THE GOSPEL** this week is from John, and like last Sunday’s Gospel, it focuses on the baptism of Jesus. John the Baptist sees Jesus, and speaks the marvelous words we echo at every Mass, words that reveal the whole mission of Jesus: “Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world” (John 1:29). John says, “I did not know him” (John 1:31) – unlike Luke, this Gospel seems to show Jesus and John meeting for the first time at this moment – and yet the names by which John calls Jesus show that he knows who Jesus is on the deepest level. He is the “Lamb of God” (John 1:29) - the one who will be sacrificed to take away the people’s guilt. Jesus will take away the sins not just of the chosen people, but, as Isaiah had foretold, of the whole world. By the testimony of the Spirit, John is able to recognize Jesus as “the Son of God” (John 1:34). At his baptism, Jesus’ true identity is revealed for those with eyes to see. And the same is true for all who are baptized in Christ’s name.

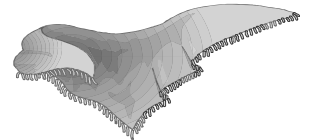

## FREE INCOME TAX PREPARATION

THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY CONTINUES TO PROVIDE FREE FEDERAL AND NJ STATE INCOME TAX PREPARATION FOR SENIORS AND DISABLED MEMBERS OF ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE PARISH. TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SERVICE, YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED MEMBER OF ST. THOMAS, AT LEAST 62 YEARS OF AGE OR DISABLED, NOT ACTIVELY EMPLOYED AND REQUIRE NO MORE FORMS AND SCHEDULES THAN THOSE LISTED BELOW.

INCOME TAX RETURNS WILL BE PREPARED BY EXPERIENCED TAX PREPARERS WHO ARE ACTIVE MEMBERS OF THE HOLY NAME SOCIETY, VOLUNTEERING THEIR TIME AND TALENT IN THE SPIRIT OF STEWARDSHIP.

INCOME TAX RETURNS WILL BE LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING FORMS AND SCHEDULES:

- FEDERAL FORMS 1040, 1040A, 1040EZ
- FEDERAL SCHEDULES A, B, D, E (RESIDENTIAL RENTAL ONLY), AND R.
- NJ STATE FORMS 1040NJ AND 1040NJHR
- NJ SCHEDULES B, C, AND HR-A

THE TAX PREPARATION PROCESS FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL OR MARRIED COUPLE WILL INCLUDE AN INTERVIEW, REVIEW OF YOUR 2009 TAX RETURN AND TURNOVER OF YOUR TAX DOCUMENTS (1099'S). COMPLETED RETURNS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN ABOUT ONE WEEK.

TAX PREPARERS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE PARISH CENTER EVERY FRIDAY FROM 10:00 A.M. TO 12:00 NOON BEGINNING JANUARY 28, 2011 THROUGH APRIL 15, 2011.

IT WILL NOT BE NECESSARY TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT. COME IN TO THE PARISH CENTER TO GET YOUR TAXES DONE OR TO SPEAK TO A TAX PREPARER.

#### **MILITARY MASS IN ORANGE**

Will commemorate Civil War's 150th Anniversary

On Sunday, February 20, 2011, Fr. David Moreno, SDB, Chaplain of the 7th Regiment New Jersey Volunteer Infantry Civil War reenactors, will celebrate a Civil War Military Mass at Our Lady of the Valley Church, 510 Valley St., in Orange. At the Mass, which is scheduled for 12:15 p.m., Fr. Moreno will be joined by dozens of reenactors from the 2nd New Jersey Brigade and other living history organizations who will participate in their Civil War uniforms and dresses. The Mass will commemorate the 150th anniversary of the beginning of the Civil War which is generally considered to have started with the bombardment of Fort Sumter on April 12, 1861. An Abraham Lincoln impersonator will present Lincoln's "Farewell to Springfield" address, Lincoln's words of farewell to his home town of Springfield, Illinois, on the occasion of his departure for his inauguration in Washington, DC.

The Mass will include Latin chants, and Civil War-era Mass vestments, and hymns, and will be followed by a three-volley military salute and the playing of "Taps" to honor all who fell during the Civil War.
