### Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Light is one of our central symbols, especially in the season of Christmas-and light is the uniting theme of today's readings. But whose light? Christ is out light-and we are called to be light.

### FIRST READING:

Justice is closely linked to the favor of God. The reading begins with a litany of just actions, works of mercy: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked. Do all this, and then, God says through the prophet, "Your light shall break forth like the dawn" (Isaiah 58:8). *Your* light, the prophet says. This light seems almost like a beacon, for when God sees this light of ours, he will respond to our prayers. The second half of the reading reiterates this idea. When we act justly, darkness is scattered.

### **RESPONSORIAL:**

Responsorial Psalm 112 is a description of the just person, who "is a light in darkness to the upright" (antiphon). The point is clear: if we act justly, we bring light into the world, we *become* light.

#### **SECOND READING:**

The Second Reading gives us one example of how to be salt and light for others. Paul, in preaching the Gospel message to the Corinthians, did not rely on himself, on "sublimity of words or of wisdom" (1 Corinthians 2:1). Instead, relying entirely on "the power of God" (1 Corinthians 2:5), Paul became an instrument, a living "demonstration of Spirit and power" (1 Corinthians 2:4).

### THE GOSPEL

2

gives us the continuation of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus began by talking of God's favorites—those who are "blessed" in God's sight (Matthew 5:1). Now Jesus tells his disciples how they are to live by using two metaphors. They are to be salt, which gives flavor and also acts as a preservative. And they are to be light—not tucked away and hidden, but visible to the world. Barbara Reid observes: "These metaphors also show that the disciples do not draw attention to themselves. Just as salt is most effective when it is not noticed in well-seasoned food and a lamp serves to illumine the other objects in the room, so the effect of disciples' good works is to point to God" (New Collegeville Bible Commentary, p. 36).
